



## PE and Sports Premium 2020-2021

We recognise that PE promotes a long-term healthy lifestyle so we provide a high-quality physical education curriculum. In addition to the PE curriculum, we offer opportunities for children to compete in competitive sport and after school - activities in order to build resilience and embed values such as teamwork, fairness and respect. Sports Premium Funding is money that is provided by the government to improve the quality of Sport and P.E. in Primary Schools.

Our PE and Sport aspires to:

For the year 2020-21 our school received £18,500 from the Government. At our school, the money is used in the following ways:

**1) To give staff an opportunity to work alongside P.E. specialists to improve quality of P.E. lessons raising fitness levels.**

**2) To develop lunchtime physical education clubs offered for all age groups in order to increase participations in sport.**

**3) To increase participation across the school in physical learning opportunities in order to develop healthy lifestyles in our pupils.**
